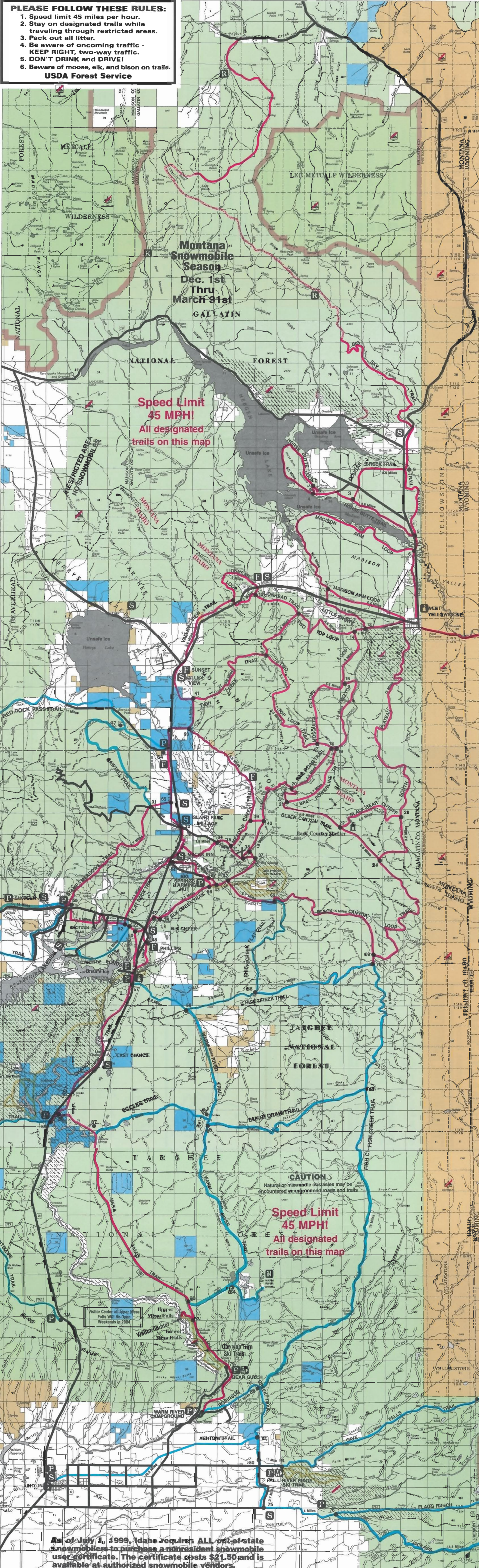


**PLEASE FOLLOW THESE RULES:**

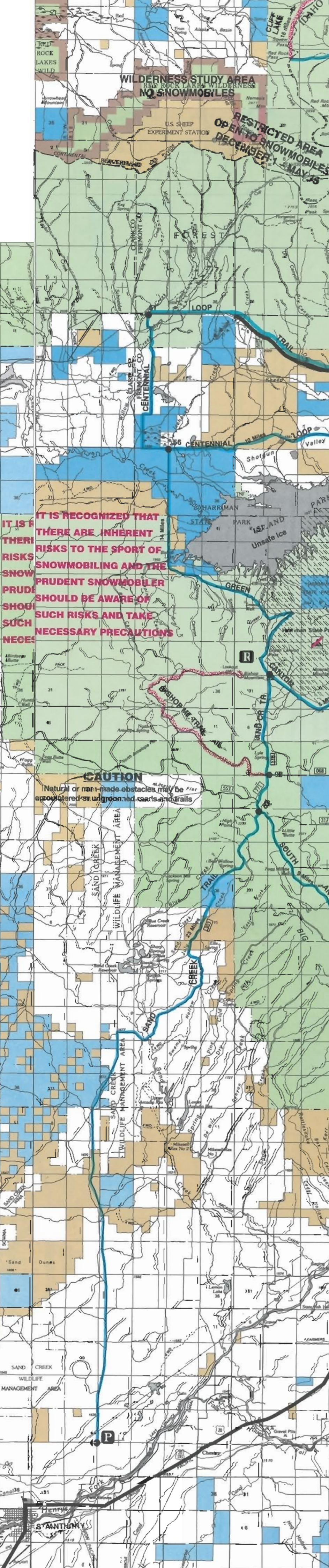

As of July 1, 1999, Idaho requires ALL out-of-state snowmobilers to purchase a resident snowmobile user certificate. The certificate costs \$21.50 and is available at authorized snowmobile vendors.
